## Legislative Assembly Two-Candidate Preferred Result

The following table shows the two-candidate preferred result and the number and percentage of votes after the full distribution of preferences for the Legislative Assembly districts. The total votes shown exclude exhausted votes which were recorded during the distribution of preferences.

The district of Riverton had the closest result with 64 votes separating the two parties, requiring a swing of 0.18% to change hands, whilst Wagin had the greatest margin with 9,595 votes separating the two parties, requiring a swing of 27.14% to change hands.

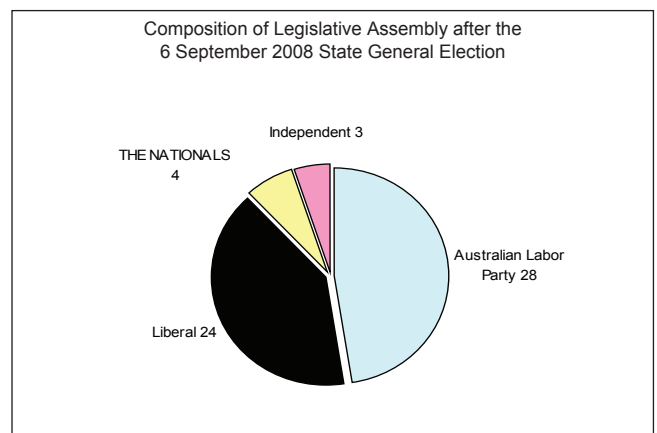
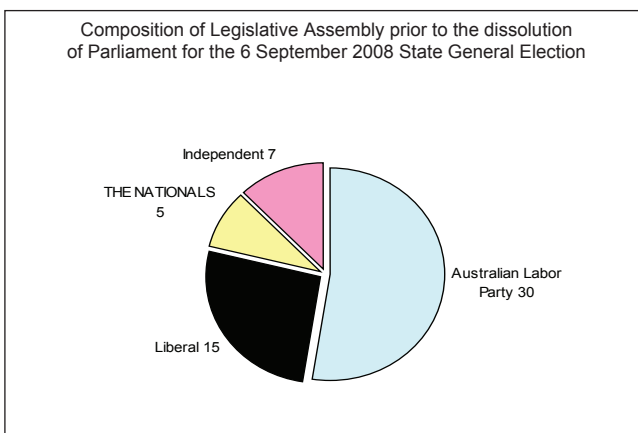

### Balance of Power Prior to and after the 6 September 2008 State General Election

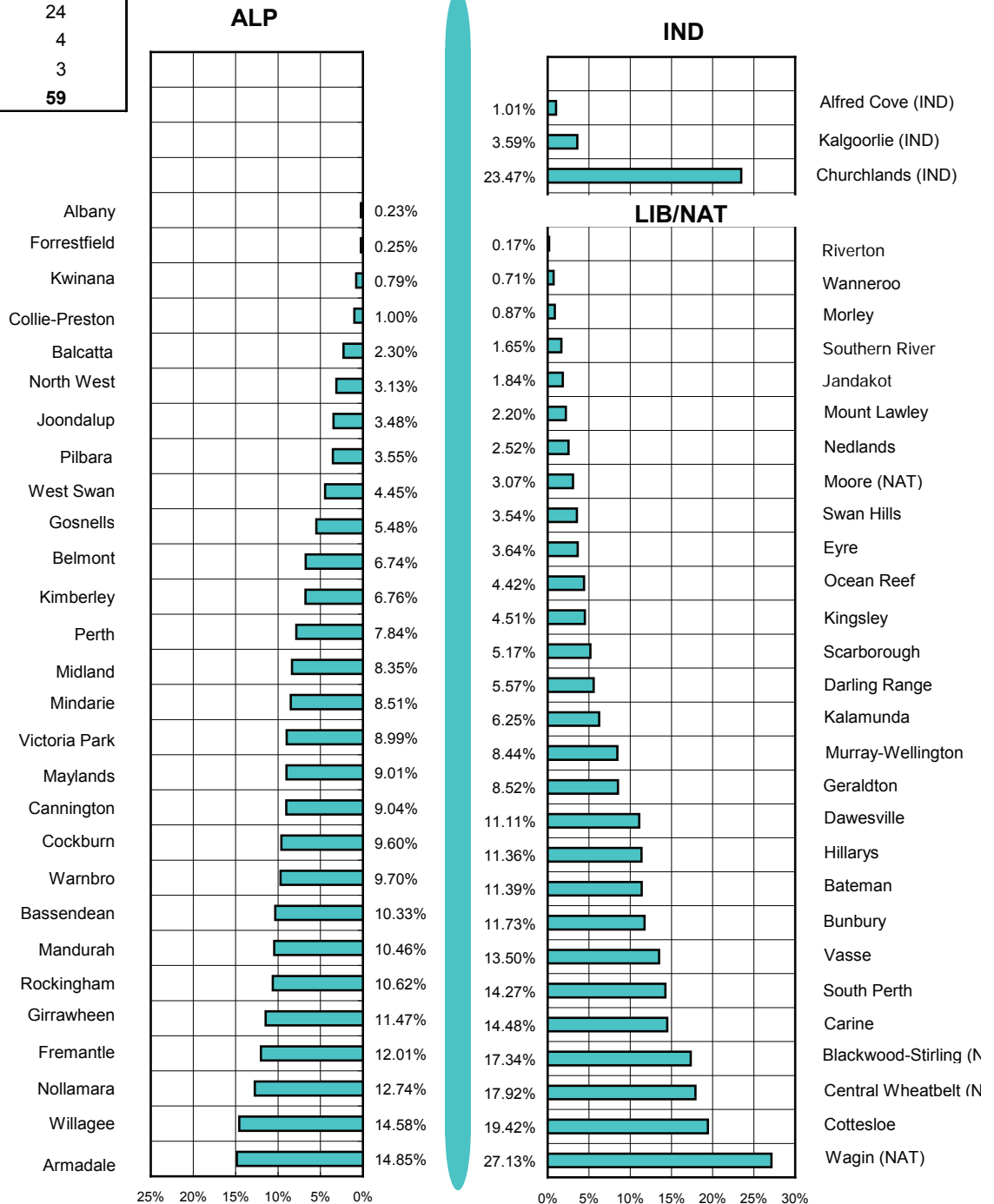

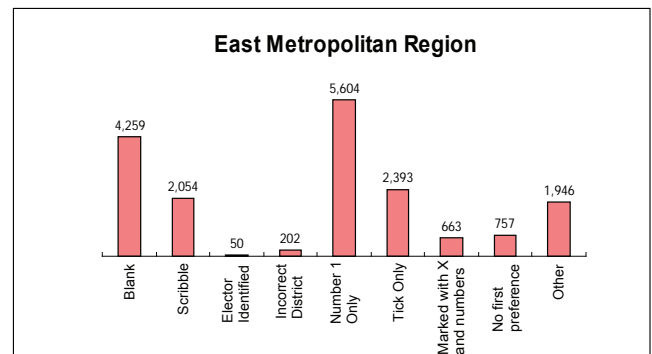
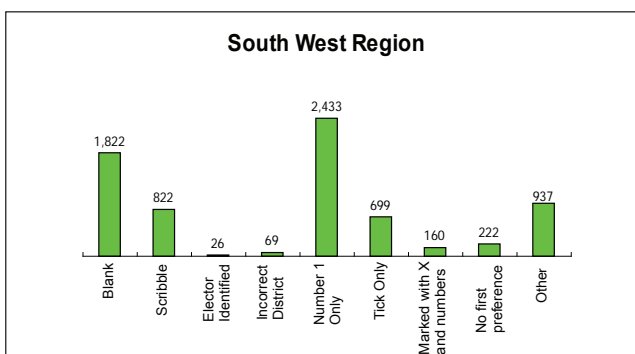
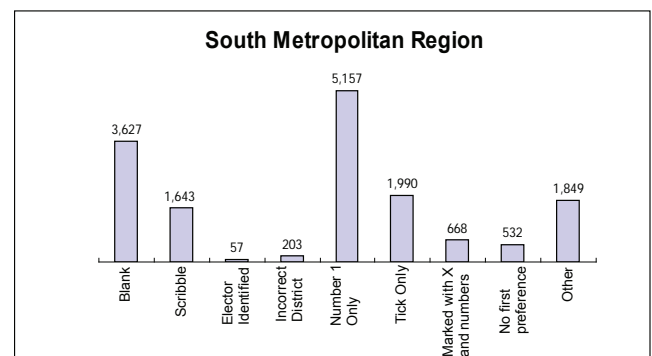
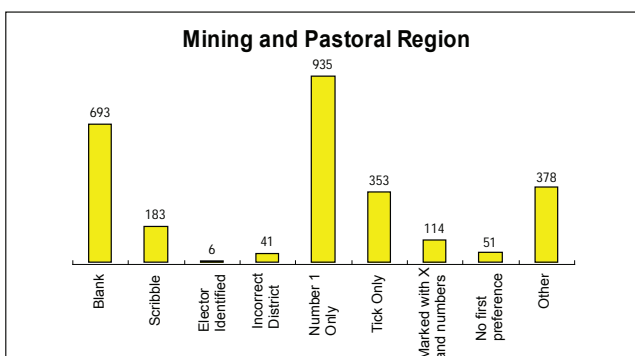
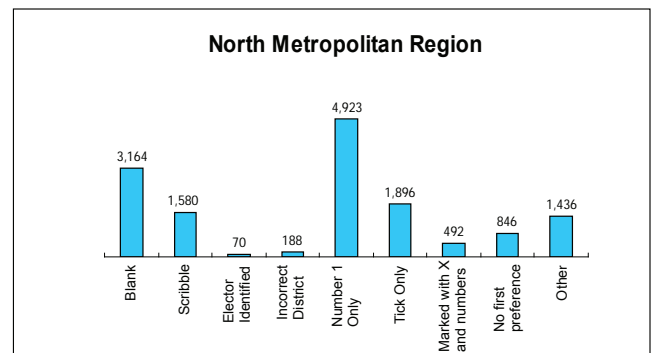
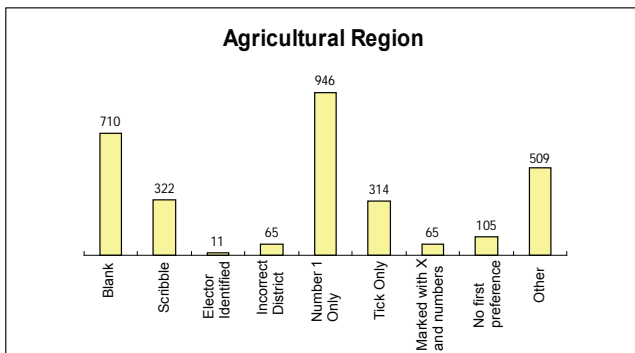
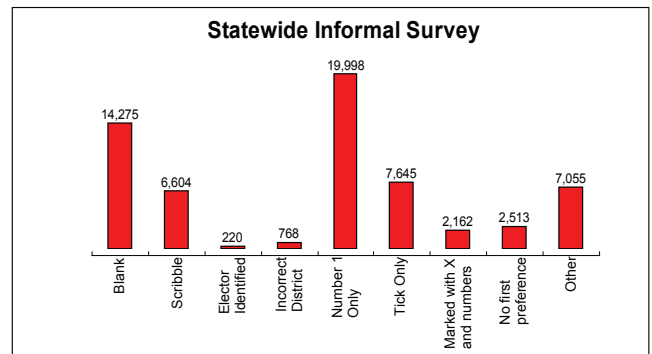
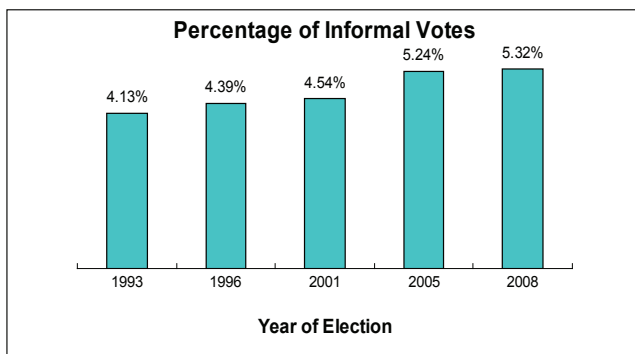
## Legislative Assembly Informal voting Summary

### Informal Voting

The percentage of informal votes increased by 0.08% in the Legislative Assembly in this election.

Ballot papers which are blank, do not show preferences in accordance with instructions and/or legislative requirements, or do not make the voter's intention clear are classified as informal. A ballot paper will also be informal if the voter can be identified through a marking on it. Informal ballot papers do not contribute to the election of a candidate and are not included in calculating the quota or absolute majority required for election.

Blank ballot papers comprised 23.31% of the informal vote, and ballot papers which were scribbled on comprised 10.78%. The largest group of informal voters who attempted to register a vote were those who indicated a first preference only (32.66%).

### First Preference Votes

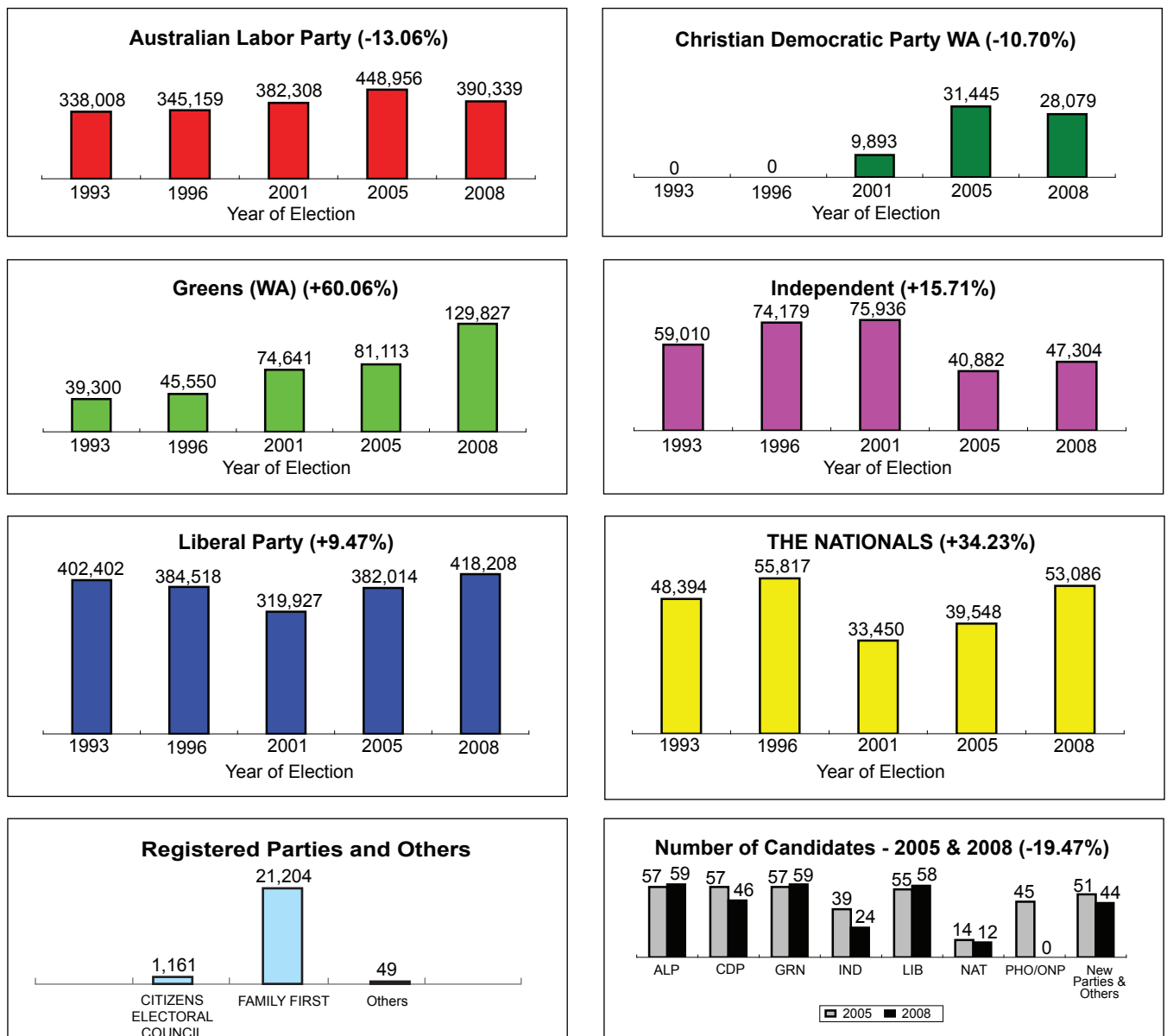
The Greens (WA) recorded the highest increase in the number of first preference votes (48,714) compared with 2005.

The Greens (WA) also recorded the highest increase in percentage of first preference votes (60.06%) compared with 2005.

THE NATIONALS recorded a significant increase in first preference votes (13,538) compared with 2005, an increase of 34.23%.

The Australian Labor Party recorded the greatest decrease in first preference votes (58,617) compared with 2005, representing a decline of 13.06%.

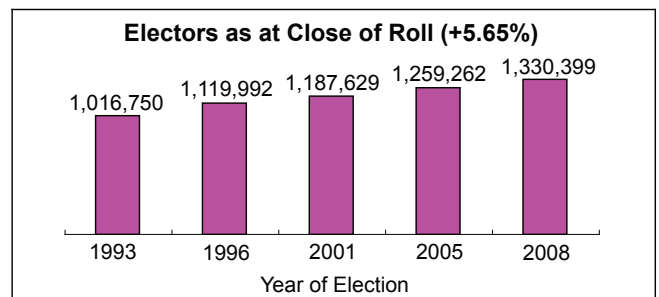
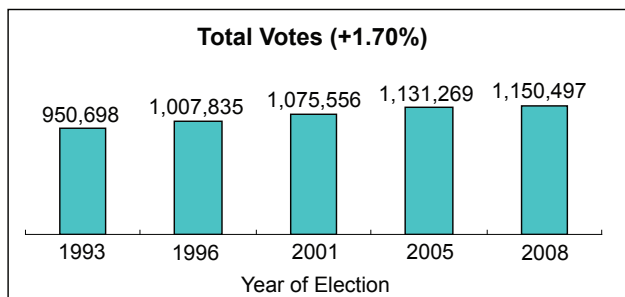
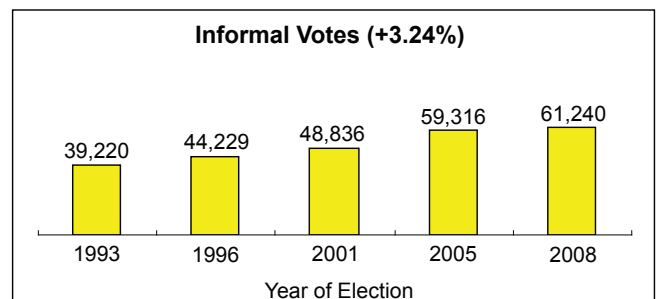
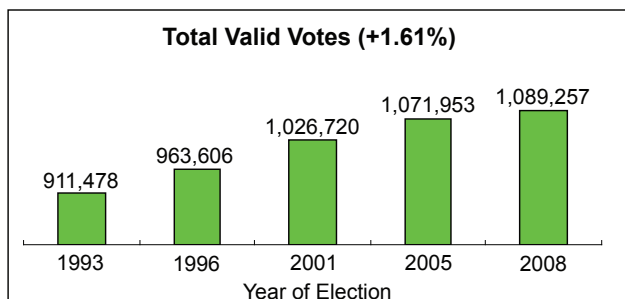
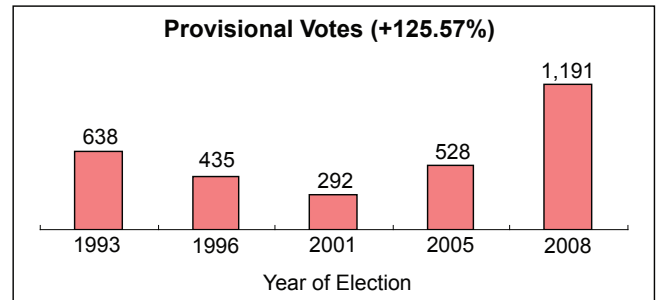
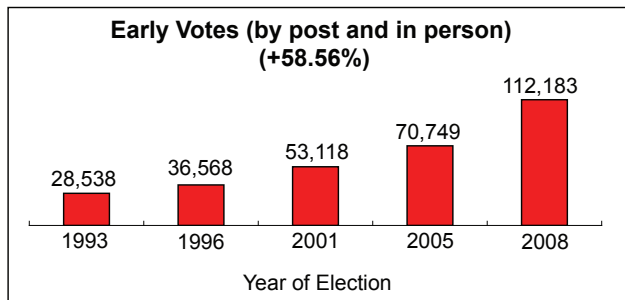
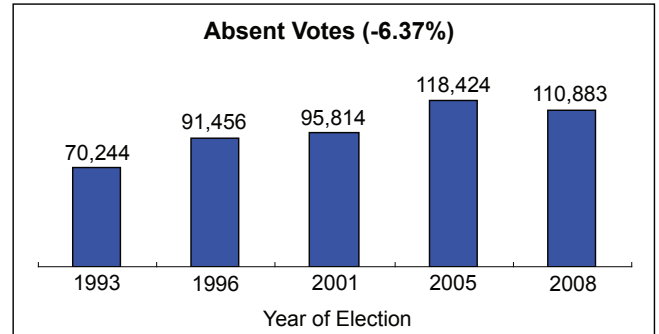
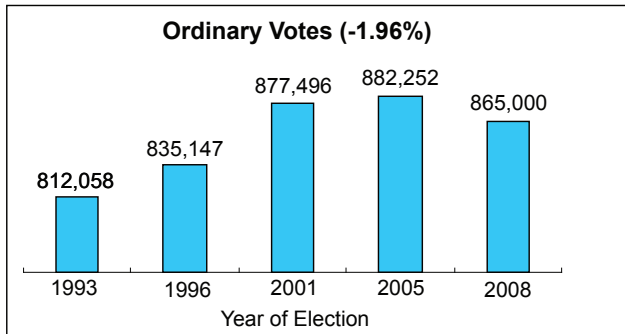
Among the other registered political parties, FAMILY FIRST recorded 21,204 votes with 34 candidates. This represented 1.95% of the first preference votes statewide. CITIZENS ELECTORAL COUNCIL with 9 candidates received 1,161 votes (0.11%). The category of 'Others' included one candidate who specified their desire not to have the word 'Independent' against their name on the ballot paper.

This has been done to provide for easier comparison with reports of previous elections. The increase in early votes may account for the decrease in ordinary votes and absent votes.

The percentage of total valid votes has decreased marginally by 0.08% with a similar percentage increase in informal votes.

Voter turnout does not include figures for absent, early and provisional votes rejected for not complying with the requirements of the *Electoral Act 1907*.
