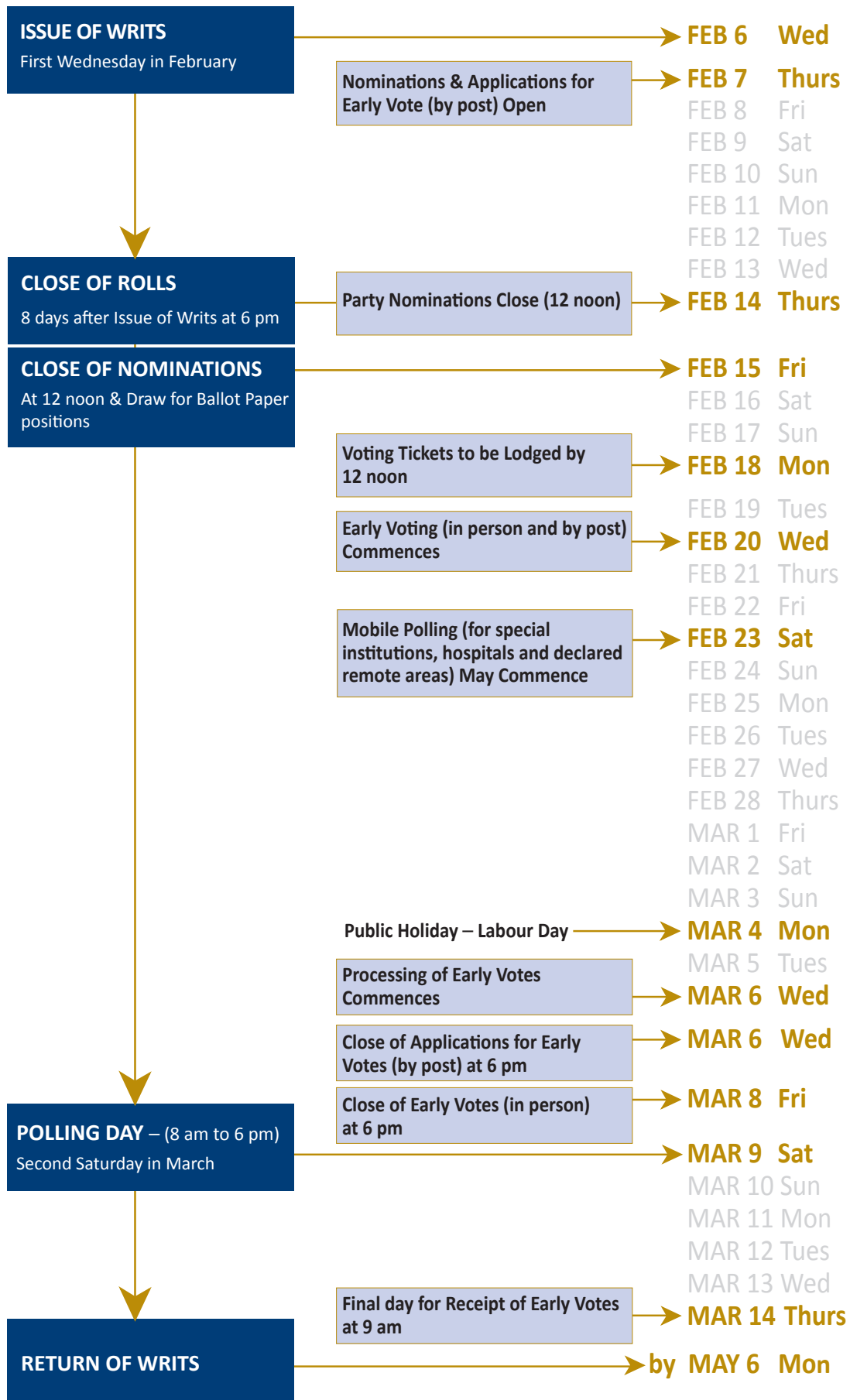

Registered Political Parties in Western Australia

The following table shows the names and abbreviations of the registered political parties that nominated candidates in the 2013 State General Election. In 2013 there were seven registered political parties compared with ten for the 2008 State General Election.

Under section 113C of the *Electoral Act 1907*, candidates may apply to have the name of a registered political party, a composite name of two registered political parties, or the word *Independent* printed adjacent to their name on a ballot paper.

In the case of Legislative Council candidates, section 80 of the Act allows two or more candidates to apply to have their names included in a group on the ballot papers for a region in the order that they specify.

Summary of Electors as at Close of Roll – 14 February 2013

The following tables show a summary of electors within districts by region, as at the close of roll, 14 February 2013. The numbers of male and female electors are also shown.

The Mining and Pastoral Region has the lowest number of electors in a region, with 73,913 electors at an average of 14,783 electors per district.

The North Metropolitan Region has the greatest number of electors in a region, with 354,077 electors at an average of 25,291 electors per district.

The district of North West Central has the lowest number of electors with 9,730 and the Butler district has the greatest with 28,575.

The average number of electors is 25,151 for a metropolitan district and 20,952 for a country district.

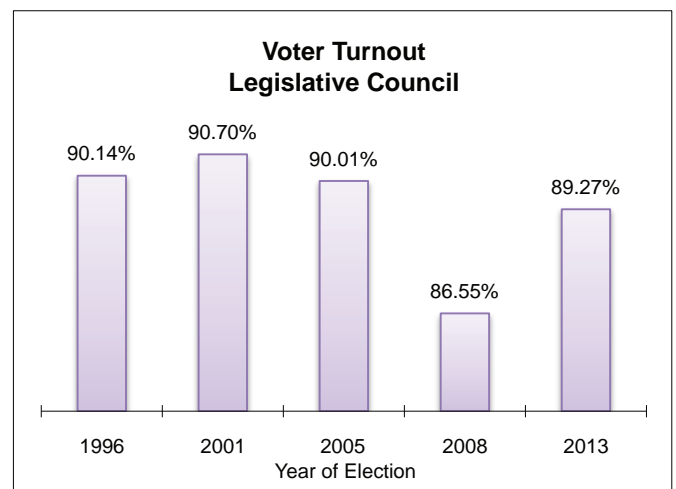
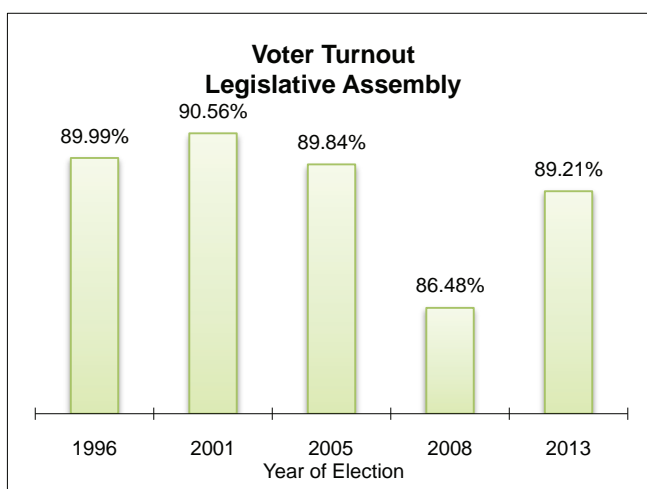
Enrolment Numbers and Turnout

The growth in enrolment numbers at successive State general elections has continued with a 6.17% increase.



Voter Turnout

Voter turnout increased by 2.73% for the Legislative Assembly and by 2.72% for the Legislative Council compared with 2008.



Note: Voter turnout does not include figures for absent, early and provisional votes rejected for not complying with the requirements of the *Electoral Act 1907*.

Voter Participation

The following table indicates the number of electors on the roll as at Thursday 14 February 2013 for each age band, together with the number and proportion of those electors recorded as having attempted to vote. The 'voted' and '% voted' categories include voters whose votes were formal and informal. It also includes absent, early and provisional votes that were subsequently rejected for non-compliance with the *Electoral Act 1907*.

Where the date of birth of an elector is not known, or was not provided, the age has been categorised as 'unknown'.
