How to Vote in the Western Australian State General Election

- If you cannot understand these instructions and need a telephone interpreter service (if a telephone is available)

Voting in your electoral district

Before you receive your ballot papers, the Polling Official sitting at the table will ask you three questions:

1. Have you cast an early vote for this election or already voted today?
2. What is your full name?
3. Where do you live?

You can give the Polling Official your EasyVote card, which has your name and address printed on it and was posted to you in the mail. If you do not have your EasyVote card with you, you can write your name and address on a piece of paper and give that to the Polling Official.

If your name does not appear on the Electoral Roll

In some cases, you may still be able to vote, but you will have to complete a declaration form. The Polling Official will help you.

Voting outside your electoral district

If you are voting at a polling place that is not in your electoral district, you are able to cast an absent vote.

You will be directed by the Polling Official to another table, where you will be asked to fill in a declaration form before you are given ballot papers. After completing the ballot papers, as per the instructions, return the ballot papers to the Declaration Official.

If you make a mistake

If you make a mistake, don't worry – just return your ballot paper to the Polling Official and ask for another one – then start again. If you need help to vote, just ask a Polling Official.

Our Voting System is Secret – No one else will know who you vote for unless you choose to tell them.
