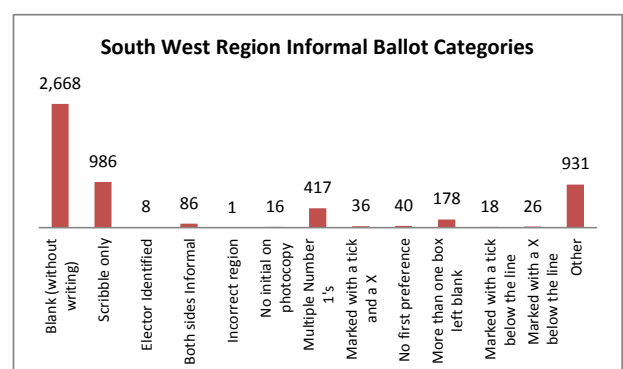
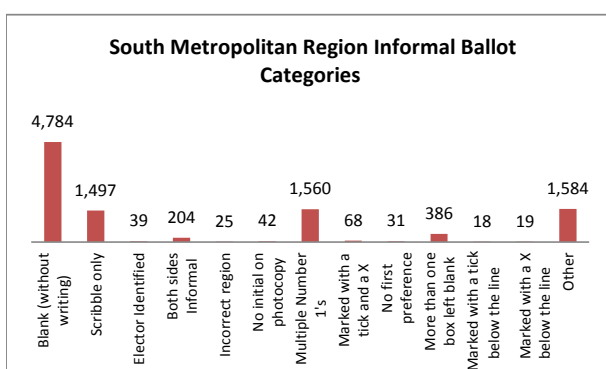
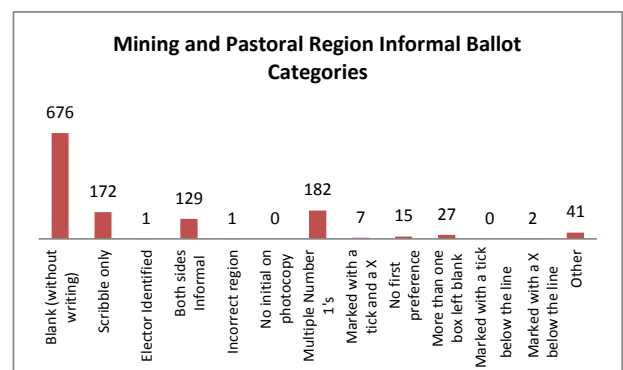
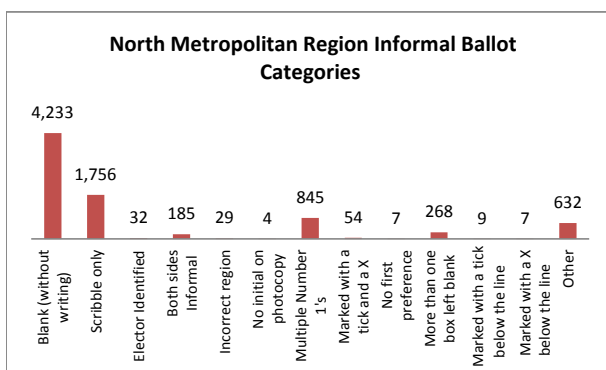
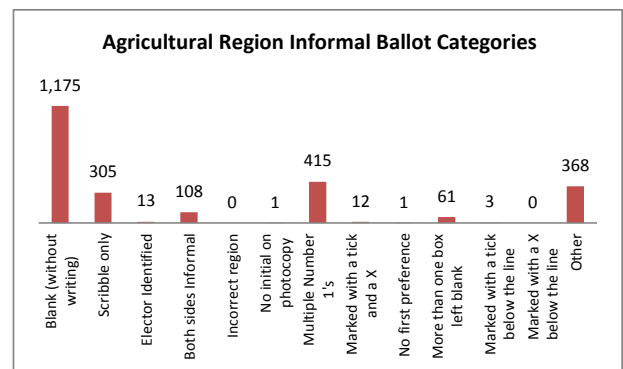
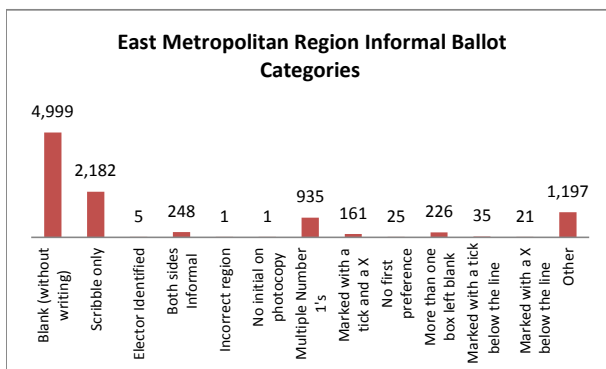
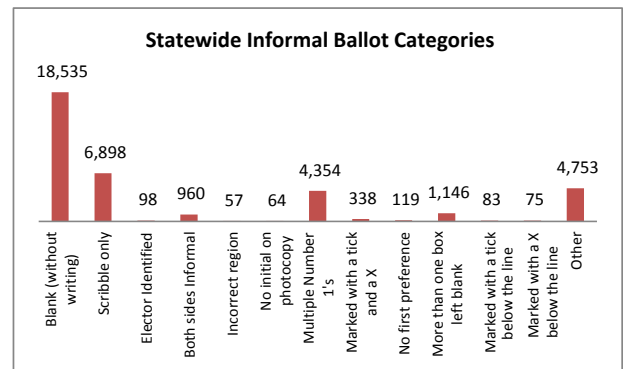
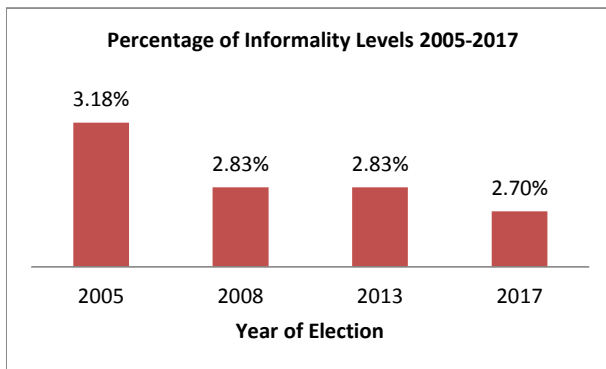
Legislative Council Informal Voting Summary

Informal Voting

The Statewide average rate of informality for the Legislative Council decreased to 2.70% at this election.

Ballot papers that are blank, do not show preferences in accordance with instructions and/or legislative requirements, or do not make the voter's intention clear are classified as informal. A ballot paper will also be informal if the voter can be identified through a marking on it. Informal ballot papers do not contribute to the election of a candidate and are not included in calculating the quota or absolute majority required for election.

In summary 'blank' ballot papers constituted 49.45% of all informal votes recorded and ballot papers that were 'scribbled' on comprised a further 18.40%.

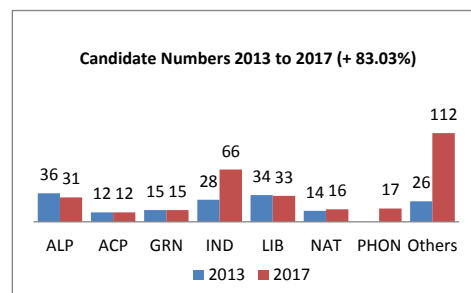
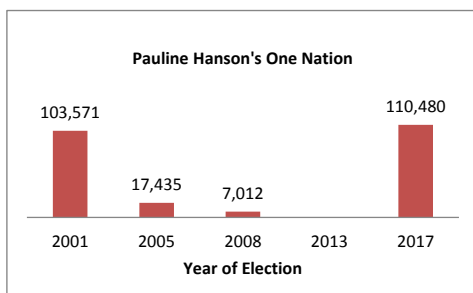
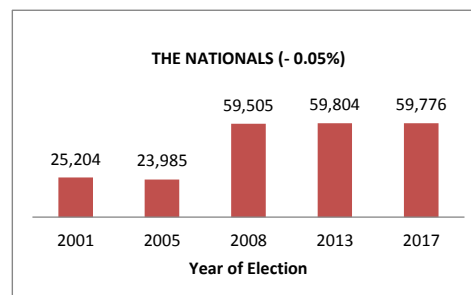
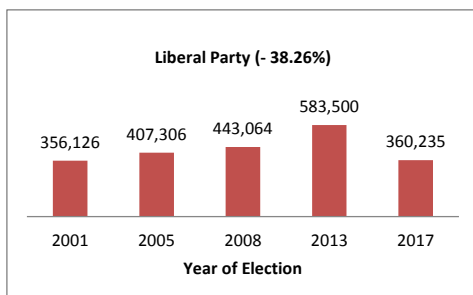
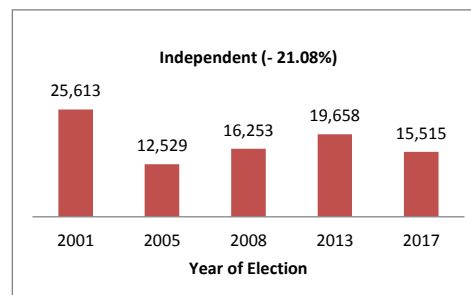
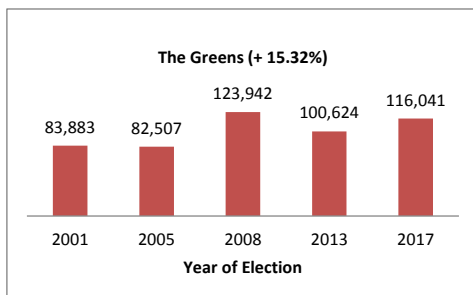
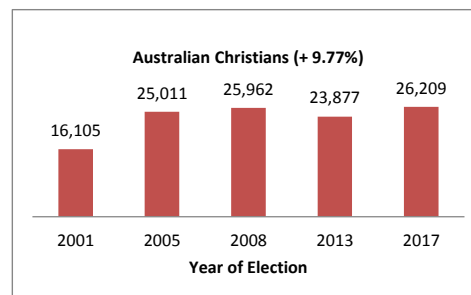
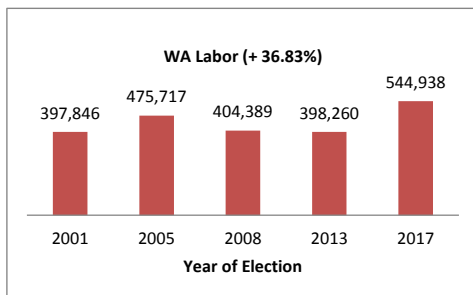
Legislative Council First Preference Votes: Comparative Summary 2001 to 2017

Balance of Power

The balance of power in the Legislative Council has shifted as a result of the 2017 State General Election with the Liberal Party losing 8 seats, taking their total to 9, and their alliance partners, THE NATIONALS, also losing 1 seat.

WA Labor gained an additional 3 seats taking their total to 14, whilst The Greens (WA) lost one seat but gained three seats. Pauline Hanson's One Nation won 3 seats and the Liberal Democrats won 1 seat. The change in representation in each region is indicated in the table below.
