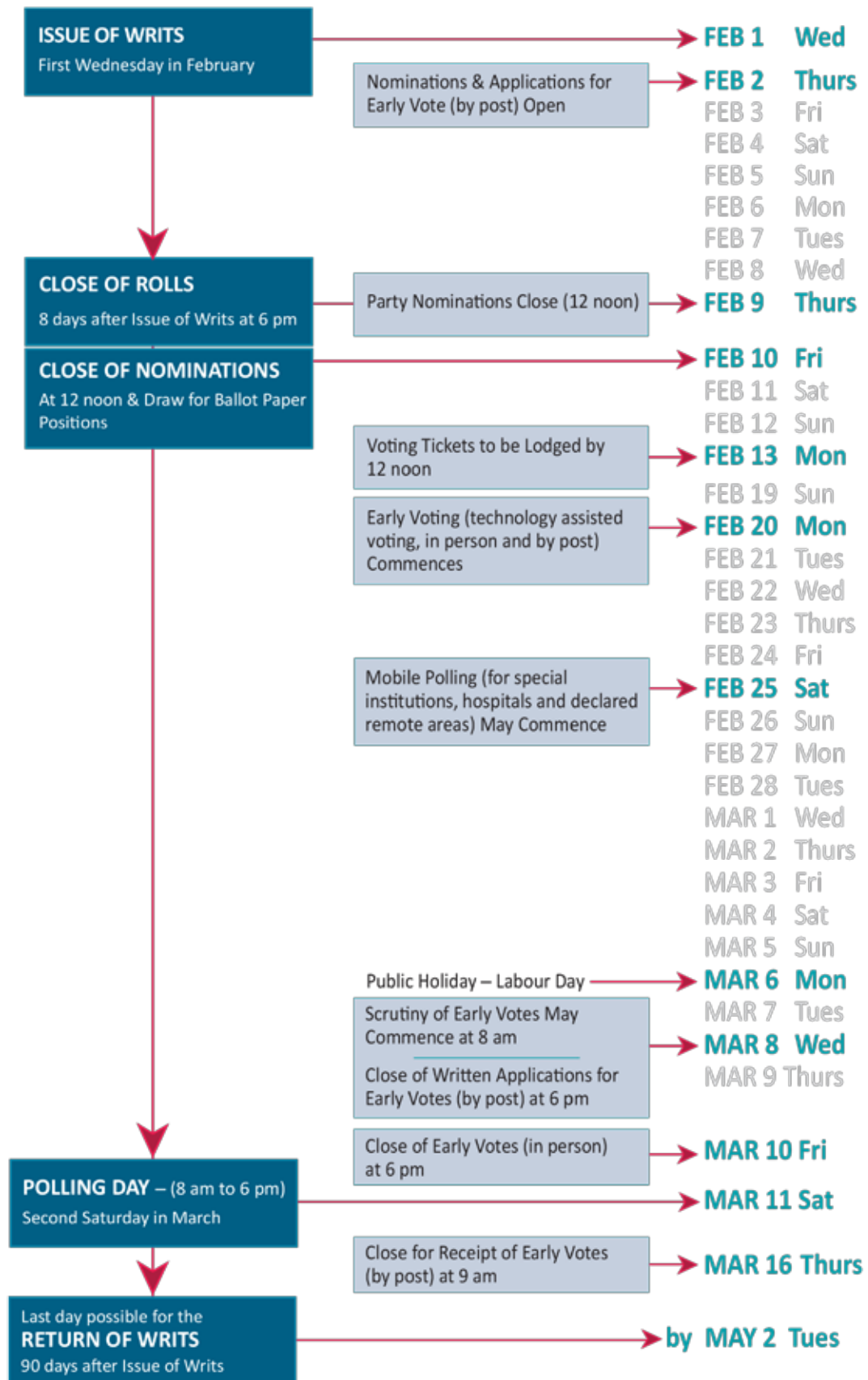

2017 State Election Timeline



Registered Political Parties in Western Australia

The following table shows the names and abbreviations of the registered political parties that nominated candidates in the 2017 State General Election. In 2017 there were sixteen registered political parties compared with seven in 2013 State General Election.

Under section 113C of the *Electoral Act 1907*, candidates may apply to have the name of a registered political party, a composite name of two registered political parties, or the word *Independent* printed adjacent to their name on a ballot paper.

In the case of Legislative Council candidates, section 80 of the Act allows two or more candidates to apply to have their names included in a group on the ballot papers for a region in the order that they specify.

Summary of Electors as at Close of Roll – 9 February 2017

The following tables show a summary of electors within districts by region, as at the close of roll. The numbers of male and female electors are also shown.

The Mining and Pastoral Region had the lowest number of electors in a region, with 68,480 electors at an average of 17,120 electors per district.

The South Metropolitan Region had the greatest number of electors in a region, with 409,325 electors at an average of 27,288 electors per district.

The district of North West Central had the lowest number of electors with 10,432 and the Swan Hills district has the greatest with 32,573.

The average number of electors was 27,813 for a metropolitan district and 24,830 for a country district.

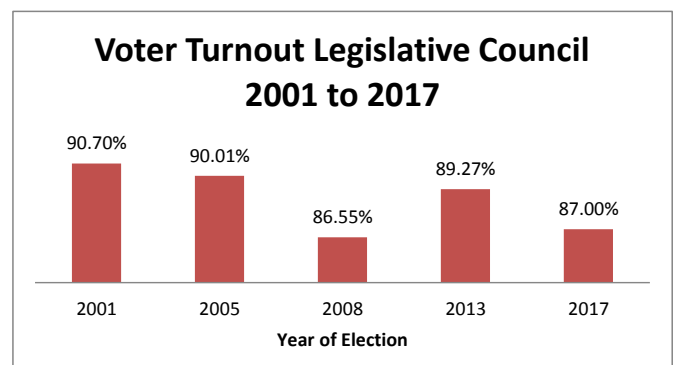
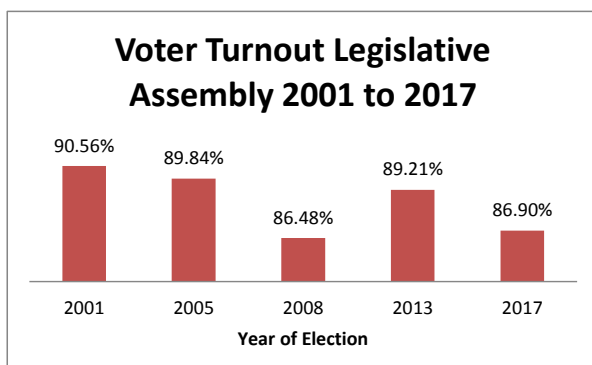
Enrolment Numbers and Turnout

The growth in enrolment numbers at successive State general elections has continued with a 12.79% increase.



Voter Turnout

Voter turnout decreased by 2.31% for the Legislative Assembly and by 2.27% for the Legislative Council compared to 2013.



Note: Voter turnout does not include figures for absent, early and provisional votes rejected for not complying with the requirements of the *Electoral Act 1907*. Slight variations in voter turnout between Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council can be caused by electors not returning both postal ballot papers or only placing one of their papers in the ballot box.

Voter Participation

The following table indicates the number of electors on the roll as at Thursday 9 February 2017 for each age band, together with the number and proportion of those electors recorded as having attempted to vote. The 'voted' and '% voted' categories include voters whose votes were either formal or informal. It also includes absent, early and provisional votes that were subsequently rejected for non-compliance with the *Electoral Act 1907*.

Where the date of birth of an elector is not known, or was not provided, the age has been categorised as 'unknown'.
